

## International Plan Audit/Planning Worksheet

### Overview

This worksheet has been developed as a tool to assist applicants and advisors in assessing an applicant's eligibility and progress to-date towards Plan completion. For brevity, requirements have been summarized below. Complete descriptions of all requirements are available in the Georgia College Undergraduate Catalog, whose descriptions are to be held as official and authoritative.

### Basic Eligibility

In order to apply for admission to the International Plan and to continue to pursue it, a student must maintain an overall 3.0 GPA or better.

### International Experience

Students must study abroad for at least one full semester (three months), either on exchange with one of our own partner universities or through transient enrollment at a foreign university or an approved program provider.

Equivalents to study abroad might be international internships, research, service-learning projects, or volunteer opportunities. Living among and immersed in the local foreign academic, research or work community will increase students' international understanding and their language competence.

If deemed appropriate by the major advisor, chair and dean, students may combine shorter term programs to achieve the equivalent of one semester. International Plan required courses may be taken during the period of study overseas if these courses are deemed equivalent to the required courses and acceptable by the major advisor, chair and dean.
