Faculty Contracts 2024-2025

Georgia College & State University is continuing to use the highly successful OneUSG electronic faculty contract distribution and e-signature system that was deployed last year. The e-contract eliminates delays with physical mail delivery systems and provides a convenient system for everyone involved in the contract process.

On June 28, an email message containing instructions was sent by Neil Jones (HR) to contract eligible recipients notifying them about the full-time faculty contract process. The electronic contract is available in the same system that houses your pay statements, W-2's, etc. The due date to respond to the contract is July 22, 2024. Please remember that during peak periods, the USG system's processing response times may be slow.

Limited term one-year faculty and part-time faculty are an important part of our university instructional team as well. Following Board of Regents – University System of Georgia policies, limited term one-year faculty and part-time faculty employment agreements are covered through the Offer/Acceptance letter and the Part-time Faculty Teaching Agreement (GC Signatures – DocuSign).

New faculty will not have access to the OneUSG System until August when their employment begins. New faculty employment agreements are also confirmed through the Offer/Acceptance letter process.

Liberal Arts Skills for the Professions and Individual Well-being

The Center for Teaching & Learning continues to organize workshops as part of the "Liberal Arts Skills for the Professions and Individual Well-Being" initiative. Currently, five workshops are being developed that will focus on showcasing skills learned for critical thinking, communication, collaboration, and teamwork. Faculty members can consider integrating this information in their teaching and share these approaches in their classrooms to help students better understand the importance of the liberal arts in the workplace and beyond. As part of the effort to develop an understanding of how liberal arts can be advanced in the classroom, the Office of the Provost supported three faculty members to attend a Lilly Conference during the summer. This is in addition to the Lilly Conference Fellowship (LCF) faculty program. This LCF award supports one faculty member to attend the Lilly Conference which, with its 40-year history, brings together participants from around the world to create a community focused on lifelong learning and the betterment of teaching in the learning environment. The Fall 2024 Lilly Conference Fellowship recipient is Dr. Natalie Toomey, Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology, Department of Professional Learning & Innovation. During the 2024-2025 academic year, Dr. Toomey will deliver insights on teaching and learning to the GCSU faculty and staff through programming sponsored by the Center for Teaching and Learning.
