#### QUICK FACTS

Dental programs are extremely competitive. **There is only 1 program in Georgia:** The Dental College of Georgia at Augusta University. Here are some elements to consider when navigating the process:

- Applications usually require some combination of these materials: minimum GPA, Dental Admissions Test (DAT) scores, letters of recommendation, a personal statement, a secondary application, shadowing hours, and an interview.
   Thoroughly read through the requirements each school/program has for admission.
- Many programs require that you apply through a common application system: American Dental Education Association Associated American Dental Schools Application Service (ADEA AADSAS), https://aadsas.liaisoncas.com.
- Secondary applications are required by most dental programs. They vary in information requested and most often require a fee.
- The number of shadowing/clinical hours required vary from program to program.
  For Augusta's program, there is no set number—but the successful applicant average is 300 hours in a dental setting.
- Letters of Recommendation: Most dental schools are seeking at least 1 letter from science faculty, 1 from an advisor, and 1 from a dentist with whom you shadowed, however this varies from school to school. #### DAT PREPARATION

#### **Dental Admissions Test (DAT)**

- The exam is broken into **4 types of questions: Natural Sciences, Perceptual Ability, Reading Comprehension, and Quantitative Reasoning**.
- You can visit Kaplan for a breakdown of scores for each test section, www.kaptest.com/study/dat/
- The exam can be re-taken after 60 days. You can take the exam a maximum of **3 times.**

- Students should plan on spending about **200-250 hours** intensely studying.
- The DAT should be taken **1 year prior** to your planned enrollment date.

## APPLICATION SERVICES (ADEA AADSAS)

#### <u>ADEA Associated American Dental Schools Application Service (ADEA AADSAS)</u>

- Many schools require your application to be submitted through this system.
- An account has to be made to utilize this application service.
- Familiarize yourself with the site, the applications themselves, and what materials are necessary for each application.
- Keep in mind that not all schools use ADEA AADSAS!
- Thoroughly read through each program's admission procedures.
- Personal Statements being submitted through ADEA AADSAS should be a general overview as to why you chose this profession.
   Pay attention to the character count (including spaces) allotted for the essay. The ADEA AADSAS has a 4,500 character limit.

## **INTERVIEW PREPARATION**

#### When preparing for professional school interviews, it is important that you practice ahead of time.

- "Why do you want to be a dentist?" or "Why our program?" are common types of questions that you want to prepare for.

## **KEY NUMBERS**

- Average GPA: science 3.4; overall 3.5
- Average DAT score: Academic Average **19.7**; Perceptual Ability **19.4**; Total Science **19.2**
- Average Shadowing Hours: 200-300

\*Check with each individual school for their GPA and score requirements. \*\*Keep in mind that quality outweighs quantity when obtaining hours.
