Sallie Coke, PhD, School of Nursing was awarded a nearly \$2.7 million, four-year Advanced Nursing Education Workforce (ANEW) grant from the Health Resources Service Agency (HRSA) of the Department of Health and Human Services. The new grant will help educate and train nurse practitioners to work in rural areas of Georgia. Georgia College was the only school in the State of Georgia to receive funding for all 7 possible years of this HRSA ANEW grant program. As author and principal investigator of this highly impactful rural health program, Dr. Coke's leadership in the federally funded program has brought GC external awards totaling \$4,246,865.
